SCHS 2023 AWARD BANQUET Honoring our Horticulturist of the Year Richard Schulhof

Saturday, October 21 at L.A. County Arboretum

The SCHS is pleased to honor Richard Schulhof as our 2023 Horticulturist of the Year in recognition of his distinguished career and work in Southern California horticulture, which has reached beyond local geographic boundaries and has already impacted multiple generations. Locally, Schulhof is probably best known for his leadership role as CEO of the Los Angeles County Arboretum, a position he held from 2009 until his recent retirement in the spring of 2023.

Inspired by a life-long love of plants, Richard has enjoyed a 50-year career in horticulture. After assisting in his grandfather's garden in Rancho Santa Fe as a child, he completed horticulture classes at San Dieguito High School in Encinitas to work in the greenhouse industry of north San Diego County. He later worked in Los Angeles area nurseries and completed internships at the Huntington Botanical Gardens and the Mildred E. Mathias Botanical Garden at UCLA. He holds a BA in landscape architecture from UC Berkeley, and master's degrees in botanic garden administration from the University of Delaware, and in Forestry from Harvard University.

It was in botanic gardens that Richard found a lasting professional home, drawn by highly diverse collections of plants. In addition to his tenure at the LA Arboretum, where he collaborated with an exceptional team to create new gardens and programs for over 600,000 annual visitors, he previously served as deputy director of Harvard University's Arnold Arboretum in Boston, as executive director of Descanso Gardens, and as a Longwood Fellow at Longwood Gardens in Pennsylvania.

Richard has also maintained a strong interest in garden-based education. He has collaborated with public schools in Boston and Los Angeles to help develop teacher training programs and life science curricula. Working with the National Endowment for the Humanities, National Endowment for the Arts, and the National Park Service, he has launched programs preserving and interpreting landscape history and design. You are invited to participate in this special evening honoring Richard Schulhof as this year's HOTY award recipient, by sharing in a delicious catered dinner with friends and enjoying the opportunity to bid on an intriguing array of silent auction items. Prior to the actual award presentation you will be hearing accolades from several of Richard's esteemed colleagues, followed by a presentation prepared by Richard for the occasion on "Adventures and Hijinks in Horticulture: Detours and Rewards in Over 50 Years of Working with Plants."

The SCHS September 14 program Senecio 'Angel Wings', and his raffle plant: Coprosma 'Pacific Sunset.' All will be in retail nurseries soon if they're not already available.

Closing out the program was Tim Becker, Director of Horticulture at the Theodore Payne Foundation for Wild Flowers and Native Plants, who shared "underutilized" garden favorite his plants, all of which are available at TPF. These included: Rhus lentii, Eriogonum x blissianum, Mentzelia laevicaulus, Phacelia grandiflora, Salvia carduacea, Calochortus plummerae, Lillium humboldtii and *Lewisia rediviva*. His choices ranged from shrubs to bulbs, perennials to annuals, and selections suitable for container gardening.

SCHS GARDEN SHARE

October in the SoCal garden is a busy time!

- Do a thorough "Fall Clean-Up" by: pruning back shrubs, clearing out dead plants and replenishing mulch.
- Replenish or start your compost pile with healthy clippings from your fall cleaning and water it in well.
- Begin your fall planting now! Add: bulbs, CA natives and cool-season veggies - then keep going with new selections & your seasonal favorites!
- Plant a tree if you've been thinking about it – this is the best time so they can become established during the months they're dormant.
- Harvest your pumpkins and other squash, as well as the last of your warm season veggies. Add any inedible pickings to the compost.
- Sow seeds! Try growing several cool-season edibles from seed and also sow plenty of CA wildflowers this is inexpensive and you'll reap bountiful rewards.


CR November 9 ONLINE
