

On Thursday, February 10, the SCHS is pleased to welcome Dr. Suzanne Simard as this year's speaker in the Ruth Borun Lecture Series.

Suzanne Simard is a Professor of

Forest Ecology at the University of British Columbia and the leader of The Mother Tree Project, which researches forest renewal practices that protect

biodiversity against climate change.

Dr. Simard's work has been published widely, with over 170 scientific articles in peer-reviewed journals, including Nature, Ecology, and Global Biology. She is also coauthor of the book *Climate Change and Variability*. Her latest book, *Finding the Mother Tree*, brings us

into the intimate world of trees, exploring the ways in which trees learn and adapt their behaviors, remember the past, demonstrate agency over the future, and cooperate with a sophistication typically ascribed to humans.

Dr. Simard's research has been communicated broadly through TED Talks and TED Experiences, as

well as articles and interviews in *The New Yorker, National Geographic, The Globe* and *Mail, NPR, CNN, CBC, and many more.*

RBLS HISTORY • MONTHLY GARDEN SHARE JANUARY MEETING RECAP •

On January 13, Arleen Ferrara, landscape designer and owner of Satori Garden Design in Los Angeles, presented a



program on horticultural therapy. During her 14 years in business, Ferrara served on the board of the L.A. chapter of the Association of Professional

Landscape Designers, certified was in permaculture, and also became a horticultural therapy practitioner.

The practice of HT is defined by the American Horticultural Therapy Association (AHTA) as "the use of a garden setting and/or plant-based activities to achieve specific goals within an established treatment, rehabilitation or vocational plan for an individual requiring services." Ferrara explained that HT works because when people interact with and nurture plants, they in turn are nurtured with a sense of calm, empathy and competence. The process itself is considered the therapeutic activity rather than the end product. HT is used by occupational health services, master gardeners, educators, activists and others. It is performed in public and community gardens, shelters, food deserts, on urban farms, in nursing homes, rehab facilities, special needs schools, and even prisons.

Ferrara outlined the various steps required to become a registered HT practitioner through programs available at community colleges, universities and master gardener programs. She pursued her own educational training in HT through Colorado State University, and in 2013 began an internship at Vista Del Mar Child and Family Services. In her time there, Ferarra designed and developed two large gardens and the horticultural therapy program that serves children and young adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. She showed pictures of the site (before and after), of selected plants growing there, teachers and students interacting through HT activities and some garden "successes."

Ferrara is also a member of the California Horticultural Therapy Network (CHTN) and shared a few of the HT programs run by members. These included an inpatient eating disorder clinic, a stroke and disabilities learning center, the Adventures To Dream community project in Long Beach and a garden program at Avenal State Prison.

February is all about watching, waiting and anticipating!

- Finish up any final rose pruning.
- Start planting cool season annuals and veggies - and mulch well!
- Pay attention to Santa Ana wind predictions and water beforehand so plants don't dry out.
- Schedule feeding for citrus and azaleas regularly until June.
- Look for seasonal weeds and remove now to slow their spread.
- Check tools for any maintenance they might need ahead of spring!

ABOUT THE SCHS RUTH BORUN LECTURE SERIES

In 2020 the Southern California Horticultural Society received a very generous endowment from the Anna and



Harry Borun Foundation to fund a horticultural speaker series in memory of Ruth Borun, a longtime SCHS member. The Ruth Borun Lecture Series was established to honor Ruth's gardening legacy by presenting significant horticulture speakers to fellow and future members of our society.

Ruth Borun inherited the gardening gene from her mother and as an adult she engaged landscape designer Chris Rosmini (SCHS Horticulturist of the Year,

1992) to create her home garden. Through Borun's collaboration with Rosmini over the years, it became a highly regarded garden that was featured in *Sunset* magazine, the *Los*





Angeles Times and in Christopher Lloyd's book, Other People's Gardens. More recently, the Borun family commissioned noted garden photographer Saxon Holt to work on the production of the new book Ruth's Garden, completed in late 2021.

Presently, the care of the garden is overseen by Nancy, one of Ruth's daughters, who is working on bringing it back to the way it was originally conceived. The photos seen here were contributed by SCHS Board President John Schoustra and show various aspects of the current garden.

Today and into the future, the Ruth Borun Lecture Series is creating memories for SCHS members new while at the same time keeping those of Ruth and her garden alive.
